Are you successful with Tomatoes?

The most popular plant in the vegetable garden is the tomato. People love to eat tomatoes and the tomato that is vine ripened and picked by hand in the backyard is the best!

Last year there were many folks who tried the tomato upside down hanging style. I hope you were successful. If not don't give up try something different.

Last year we took a specific variety of tomato, and put it in a 7 to 10 gallon pot filled with *Fertilome Potting Soil*, with a cage, and put it on my fathers back porch. He picked all the tomatoes he needed starting in July all the way through the fall. He fertilized with *Fertilome Blooming and Rooting* at each watering. He had no insect or disease problems. It was easy!

Last year I got to visit with two different farmers who came to my store who told me their method of growing tomatoes. Both took post hole diggers and dug deep big wide holes in their garden. They then filled that hole with *Fertilome Potting Soil*. They caged the tomatoes. They then used *Fertilome Blooming and Rooting* fertilizer. These guys told me they had been planting tomatoes like this for years and were very successful.

One of the farmers told me a couple of years ago he tried potting soil brand X to try and save a little money and he said the tomato crop was a complete failure. He said, "I will never do that again!" He said he was going to stick with the Green Haus potting soil due to trust and dependability.
